From the Interim Executive Director

On air, online, in the classroom, community, and your living room — WUCF's impact is everywhere.

As we reflect on the past year, we are thankful for our dedicated WUCF staff, who showed continued resilience and helped ignite a year of exciting growth and opportunity for the station. They remained focused on producing excellent programming and educational resources that reflect the stories of our Central Florida community.

Through this Community Impact Report, we want you to see how your support is being put directly into the Central Florida community we serve. It takes all of us to make a difference.

- The WUCF Production Team provided weekly updates and conversations around the affordable housing crisis, transportation concerns, climate resilience, and ongoing pandemic challenges for education and healthcare professionals.
- The WUCF Education Team expanded its standards-aligned Kindergarten Ready Summer Learning toolkits and interactive sessions to include co-learning activities and resources for all curriculum areas. Sessions were recorded in both English and Spanish, allowing the caregiver to focus on engaging with their child and becoming a partner in learning.
- WUCF viewer favorite Central Florida Roadtrip also expanded this year. Working in collaboration with public media stations statewide, Florida Road Trip now explores the stories, history, and people across Florida.
- WUCF 89.9 FM Jazz & More launched In the Key of Latin Jazz, a new monthly podcast featuring guests who are the heartbeat of Latin Jazz. This season we featured well-known and up-and-coming artists, including Arturo Sandoval, Roberto Menescal, Xiomara Torres, and Juan Carlos Quintero.

We are also incredibly proud of the unprecedented accolades our producers received at a regional and national level last year. WUCF won its first TWO national Edward R. Murrow Awards, thanks to its partners within the University of Central Florida and around the state.

As WUCF TV celebrates ten years of serving the Central Florida community, we remain thankful for the continued support of the University of Central Florida, elected local, state, and national leaders, the 26,000 (and growing) WUCF members who made generous contributions, and you. Your continued generosity allows our programs and services to thrive on all platforms, reinforcing our critical work.



Early Learning

WUCF presents innovative programs that meet the direct needs of children in our region.



More than 575 participants

These monthly interactive events feature PBS KIDS resources and activities that engage caregivers and their children as well as local preschools.



4 virtual workshops, 7,000 Kindness Kits

Celebrating kindness is a core focus of our largest educational engagement event, Be My Neighbor Day. Kits were distributed through local libraries and filled with activities and supplies that encouraged families to celebrate what it means to be a kind and caring neighbor.



6 virtual sessions in English and Spanish

In the summer of 2022, thanks to support from Orlando Magic Youth Foundation, the WUCF Education Team offered these interactive sessions and also created Family Co-Learning Toolkits containing a Caregiver guidebook, hands-on learning tools and supplies that support Kindergarten readiness.

As part of our commitment to the community, PBS LearningMedia and WUCF provide free access to standards-aligned educational tools for PreK-12 classrooms. Central Floridians accessed nearly 300,000 resources in FY2022.

Throughout 2022, WUCF was honored for work that ranged from in-depth perspectives on community issues to educational intitiatives and historical retrospectives.




